Housatonic Community College was one of two community colleges in the system that **increased enrollment** from spring 2016 to spring 2017. Although enrollment has been primarily part-time for HCC students, this spring full time enrollment increased 4.5% (n=+ 64 students), thus driving up the FTE (full time equivalent), total seat count, and total credit hours.

Note: In the tables and on the graph above, "Other" is the count of students who reported themselves as Asian, American Indian or Alaskan Native, Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander, more than one race or any other race.
