## **Participants**

- Participants who are accepted into the program will receive hands-on training and practical safety instruction in the field of electrical line construction.
- Skills taught will include the safe handling of high- and low-voltage lines, utility poleclimbing, hardware installation, and managing live lines with appropriate protective gear.
- Upon completion of the program, participants will be prepared to be entry-level line workers.
- Through The WorkPlace, participants can receive this training at no-cost. To be eligible for funding, participants must be:
  - Legally able to work in the U.S.
  - Either be unemployed or underemployed
